

May 3, 2015 Fifth Sunday of Easter (B)

From The Desk of Msgr. Corrigan:

May is a glorious month. Not only because nature is blooming, but also because it is the time of First Communion and Confirmations in our parish. These sacrament and the preparations for them imprint on our children the ability to hear the call of the Good Shepherd. Hopefully this ability will remain forever. I never fully understood the meaning of last week's Gospel until I actually heard shepherds calling their own sheep to them. In some places there is a common grazing ground for all the sheep. They are distinguished from one another by a small distinctive mark e.g. paint on their wool. However, it makes it easier for a shepherd to gather his own sheep if he has trained them to come to him by teaching them to follow his unique vocal signal. "They hear his voice, his call".

What better way to describe what parents do when they go to church with their children. They are teaching them to hear the call of God. The sacraments: Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation, Confession are the way that they are being imprinted with the awareness of the presence of the Trinity in their lives.

St. John was puzzled by the fact that so many did not hear the call of Jesus. Why do some hear it and others don't? In our world we no longer live in communities where once everyone automatically believed the same faith. It is a pluralistic world-many different beliefs, philosophies, and ways of life. We have to work much harder to hold onto our Catholic way of looking at life. All the more important to teach our children to hear the call of the Good Shepherd.

Speaking of nature blooming! Our two gardens looked spectacular last Sunday. It is the result of over 600 bulbs being planted last autumn. Looking at the beauty of the flowers and then hearing our bells of St. Mary's ring out an Easter hymn, I felt like I was experiencing a little bit of Paradise on South Broadway.

Two suggestions to help care for our planet earth, pick up trash lying in the street (this is easy). Don't use the store's plastic bags when you go shopping for food. Bring your own non-plastic grocery bags (this is difficult).
