May 21, 2017 Sixth Sunday of Easter (A)

From the Desk of Rev. Msgr. Hugh J. Corrigan:

I have become obsessed (perhaps too much) with the story of the early church. I say "story" not "history" because we know that Luke is reshaping the facts and events in order to portray Christianity in the best possible light. All

"historians" did this at that time. Still, even without embellishing this first, second and third generation of Christians were remarkable. They not only survived but were able to grow. Take one example: the Coming of the Kingdom of God. They thought Jesus of Nazareth was about to bring the Kingdom of God to earth when He entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. When he rose from the dead they were sure he was here to stay and bring the Kingdom. The Ascension had to be a total shock. As they began their ministry, they were sure their own people would accept Jesus as the Messiah. Then Jesus would return in his glory in Jerusalem. 95% of the Jewish people would eventually reject Jesus as their Messiah. Jerusalem would not be the place of the "Second Company" because it was completely destroyed in 675C.E. So how did they survive and grow? They said it was the Holy Spirit. I doubt whether it was only the Holy Spirit. Their leaders adapted (not without controversy) to the changing circumstances. They believed the Holy Spirit was inspiring and leading them. This belief sustained them through all the difficulties they faced. We honor them today by believing that this same Holy Spirit is working in us. When our young people receive Confirmation on Wednesday, we are reminded that we still believe that this same Holy Spirit is leading us.
