Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)

From the Desk of Rev. Msgr. Hugh J. Corrigan:

After reading about the refugee crisis in today's world I become upset. Then when I saw the projections about the future I became even more upset. The future looks horrible. Because of increased population growth and lack of water and other resources in many places, millions of people will die and millions more will flee their homes. This will cause havoc throughout the world.

Our readings in today's liturgy seem to speak directly to us. Jeremiah is in despair. The chaos in the Middle East today looks a lot like what was happening at the time of Jeremiah. Jeremiah, who was worked for forty years to try to help his people, is angry at God for making him do this impossible job. But he refuses to give up. "Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked". In our second reading Paul is also facing despair because of the evil in humanity caused by the sin of Adam. But this will be overcome by the grace of God in Jesus. In the Gospel, Matthew is trying to encourage the first Christians even though they are suffering persecutions from their own families. "God is with us."

We can't give up on humanity. Against all the odds we still must try in our own way "to rescue the life of the poor". Remember St. Mary's history. Our parish was founded in 1848 by immigrants fleeing a famine in Ireland. One million people had died and more than one million fled their country.

<u>Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time:</u> Disciples can expect to be confronted at any time by those who seek to harm them. We may not necessarily suffer the fate of modern-day martyrs in Asia and the Middle East, but we know well what we may face even here at home if we talk publicly about our faith. So what comfort to hear Jesus tell us to not be afraid to proclaim our faith from the housetops, for even the hairs on our head are counted by God, who loves us and sustains us.
