I saw the movie "Selma". It was excellent-although I think it was a little unfair to President Johnson. The Selma-Montgomery March was a very important event in the history of the United States and it should not be forgotten. As I mentioned in last week's bulletin it is very difficult to change society. Fifty years ago the civil rights movement did change our society for the better. I thought then that we were on the threshold of making more changes, especially eradicating poverty in our rich nation. We have made progress but not nearly enough. When I get discouraged and say to myself that it will never happen I remember Selma and try not to give up. I also remember that this shining moment did not happen overnight. It took years of planning and endurance by African-Americans and the brilliance and strategy (especially non-violence) of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We honor his memory tomorrow and give thanks for his life.

**Second Sunday of Ordinary Time:**

Today we begin a stretch of Ordinary Time Sundays that will last about five weeks. We start with John's account of the call to the disciples. Having just celebrated a season marking the coming of the **Lord**, we now begin to see the adult **Jesus** at work. Having recalled our own baptism at last week's commemoration of the **Baptism of the Lord** today would be a good day to reflect on how we too have been called by the **Lord** in our baptism.

**In the first reading,**

1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19; **Samuel** responds to **God's** call. He listens attentively to every word.

**In the second reading,**

1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20; **Paul** reminds us that our bodies belong to **Christ** and are temples of the **Holy Spirit**. Therefore, we are to avoid sin.

**In the Gospel,**

John 1:35-42; **Jesus** is identified as the **Lamb of God**. John's disciples become disciples of **Jesus**.

**Today' Focus: Disciples in Our Whole Being:** *Being a follower of **Christ** isn't something we do just with our minds, or even with mind and heart together, we follow **Christ** in body, mind and spirit.*
