Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

From The Desk of Msgr. Corrigan:

On Thanksgiving day, in addition to our 8:15 and 12:05 Masses we will celebrate a special Thanksgiving Mass at 9:00 am. Participants are encouraged to bring food for the poor and needy.

Looking up and enjoy the beauty of our church, in 1998, we installed recessed lighting in the ceiling of the church. This enables us to see more clearly the architectural design of our Romanesque church and appreciate the beauty of our smaller stained glass windows. I included in the bulletin last week a diagram of these twenty windows with the promise of describing each window. I begin with the window numbered "5B" on the north side of the church. The identification of this man as a Pope is obvious (from the crown tiara he is wearing) but what Pope is he? We are not certain but Fr. Barry Bossa, our expert, thinks it is probably Saint Pope Leo the Great. I am writing on Tuesday, November 10th, which is his feast day. Fr. Bossa was a Pallotine priest stationed at Mt. Carmel Church, our neighbor. He has since died.

The liturgical calendar, called the "Ordo", has this to say about our Pope Leo: Leo died in 461: eminent pastor and preacher; defender of the Roman primacy; combated Pelagianism and Manichaeism; his tome on Christ's two nature was adopted by the Council of Chalcedon (451), many of his prayers are found in the Roman Missal; saved Rome from marauding Huns and Vandals.


Fr. Bossa thinks it is Pope Leo "because his features bear a very strong resemblance to Pope Leo XIII who was pope at the time (1878-1903) when the windows were installed. It was a common way of memorializing individuals. Leo wears the triple crown of the Papal Office-representing the three functions of a chief bishop-to teach, to govern and to sanctify. Leo the Great wears a white alb and a red cape with golden orphreys. He was not a martyr but endured a lot of aggravation from the raids of Attila the Hun. His right hand is over his heart. His left hand tucks up the red cape and holds the three barred processional cross, symbolic of the Bishop of Rome. Leo died in Rome on November 10, 461. In a time of great disorder he was the only one in "Rome to put things together. Because of Leo, the office of Pope reached great levels of power and influence".

In the second reading, Hebrews 10:11-14,18: we hear that, **Jesus** offered the perfect sacrifice to take away sin. Now **Jesus** sits at the right hand of the **Father in heaven**.

In the Gospel, Mark 13:24-32: **Jesus** warns about the coming end of the age. The **Son of Man** will come with great power and glory.
