From The Desk of Msgr. Corrigan:

Why would the Holy Family be today classified as “refugees”?

Did you know that in 1847, the year before our parish was founded, that St. Mary’s Street was called South Street? That South Broadway was called Albany Post Road because it was the route the stagecoach used to get from New York City to Albany. That Getty Square was named after the Getty House which was a favorite resting stop for the passengers on the stagecoach? That before our church was opened on December 25, 1848; our parishioners rented a large room in the Getty House for the celebration of Mass on Sundays? That three prominent non-Catholic residents of the Village of Yonkers contributed generously to the building of our first church? These donations were not entirely altruistic. They owned the real estate around the church and knew that Irish laborers would soon be buying their newly built houses. That the new St. Mary’s church had a roof but no ceiling, benches not pews, and no windows? Two hot bellied wood stoves tried to heat the congregation. Electric lights had not yet been invented. They probably used gas lights or candles. Frozen though they might have been, they were overcome with joy at this their first Christmas at St. Mary’s one hundred and sixty-seven years ago.
