Second Sunday of Lent (year C)

From The Desk of Msgr. Corrigan:

Stained glass windows: Clerestory south side; 1a and 1b Stephen and Aloysius Gonzaga. They are placed together because of their youth.

- ❖ 1a. St. Stephen-One of the first deacons in the early church. He is considered the first martyr of the church. After a trial in the court of the high priest, he was stoned outside the gates of Jerusalem by Jewish authorities because of his outspoken criticism. His story is in the Acts of the Apostles.
- ❖ 1b. St. Aloysius Gonzaga-He was a Jesuit in training in Rome. While continuing his studies in philosophy and theology, he taught the catechism to the young. Rome at that time was decimated by cholera. While ministering to the plague victims, he caught the disease and died on June 21, 1591. He is the patron saint of altar boys.

We now have one of the ciboria that were used in Pope Francis's Eucharistic Celebration in Madison Square Garden in 2015. Priests distributed Holy Communion from these ciboria. A ciborium is then placed in the tabernacle. The consecrated hosts are now called The Blessed Sacrament.

We also have one of the ciboria from Pope Benedict XVI's Mass in Yankee Stadium. Our Pope Francis's ciborium will be in the tabernacle in the main church. Pope Gregory's ciborium will be in the tabernacle in the chapel.
