Seventh Sunday of Easter (year C)

From The Desk of Msgr. Corrigan:

The title of my book on the history of our parish 1848-2016 includes the words “reflections by the pastor”. I added these words so as not to pretend that I could write a strict scholarly history. There is simply not enough primary sources on which to base a history. This changed when the minutes of Parish Council meetings began to be preserved in our archives. Although these minutes don't tell the whole story (what was said was sometimes deliberately not recorded), they do reveal a significant part of the story and can be considered primary sources.

I thought of this as we read the Acts of the Apostles. They are not historical documents in the modern sense of the term. Whatever exactly happened has been refashioned to suit the purposes of the author, Luke. This was quite acceptable in those days. I would love to read the minutes of the meetings of the early church because these first and second generation Christians accomplished a most remarkable thing: they not only survived but laid the foundations for the future success of what would become the Catholic Church. They attributed this success to the Holy Spirit. There is a lot more to the story than the miraculous working of the Spirit but let us leave it at that, and celebrate today and next week that Spirit.

**First Reading:** Acts 5:55-60(page33) – enemies silence the voice of a servant of God: but the message of the gospel continues to spread to all nations.


**Responsorial Psalm:** Psalm 97 (page 33) - *“The Lord is King, the most high over all the earth!”*
