

## June 12, 2016 Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

### From the Desk of Rev. Msgr. Hugh J. Corrigan:

Thanks to increased giving in our Sunday collections (especially in our two Spanish speaking Masses), we are now able to construct a new concrete sidewalk in front of the convent garden and an asphalt sidewalk in front of the chapel. We will also be conducting an energy audit of the church and rectory (recommended by the Archdiocese of New York).

My book on the history of our parish (1848-2016) will be available for sale at the end of the month. The book will arrive from the publisher on Saturday, June 25. Since I won't be able to review the finished book until that time, I want to wait a few days before it becomes available to everyone. It will be a very handsome looking book with a hard cover and many photographs. The title on the front cover is:

*Parish of St. Mary's of the Immaculate Conception  
Yonkers 1848-2016 Reflections by the Pastor, Rev. Msgr. Hugh J. Corrigan*

The front cover will also feature an outline of the front of the church. The cost is \$30.00 all the proceeds will go to St. Mary's Church for the repair of our stained glass windows. If you want the book mailed to you or friends, add \$5.00 for shipping costs. I know you will look at the photographs but please read the history. It took me twenty five years to research and write the story.

People are always asking me about the flowers in the garden. This year there are two outstanding ones. One is a blue "Spiderwort", sometimes called "widows tears". Its Latin name is *commelina coelestis*. I bought two of these plants three years ago and they have reproduced into ten plants today. It is a perennial which usually means that it flowers briefly once a year but this plant flowers all summer long. The second plant is called (I think) "Selina", its color is fuchsia. I couldn't find it proper name in my encyclopedia of garden plants. It can easily be misnamed a weed. The seeds flew into our garden a few years ago and I have been harvesting its seed (it flowers only once). Last fall I planted some of the seeds in the convent garden and they have flourished. If you go into this garden today you will see hundreds of these plants. You can also see them growing between the stone pavers on the path to the rectory.

We need altar servers for the 5pm Mass on Saturdays, 7:30 am and 11:00 am Masses on Sundays. The requirements are that you have received First Holy Communion and you are at least in the fourth grade. You can choose your Mass. If interested, write your name, address, and your telephone number on paper and put it in the basket on Sunday.

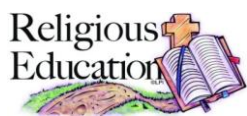

**First Reading:** 2 Samuel 12:7-10 (page 50) – King David listens to the words of a prophet; he discovers the power of repentance.

**Responsorial Psalm:** Psalm 32 (page 51) - "Lord, forgive the wrong I have done!"

**Second Reading** Galatians 2:16,19-21 (page 51) – Paul tells us that faith and Baptism open us to divine life; Christ comes to live in us, and we live in Christ.

**Gospel:** Luke 7:36- (page 52) – Jesus points out how a woman whose sins have been forgiven is saved by her strong faith
